## Objective

John Guest, one of our key suppliers, as part of their charity initiative wanted to support their local school to ensure they had a clean and hygienic water supply for the students and staff alike. With over 1600 pupils at the school, they needed a solution which would provide clean and hygienic filtered water in high volume, whilst providing a more sustainable alternative to single-use plastic, allowing the pupils to stay hydrated, healthy and fit to learn. Borg & Overström were happy to collaborate with their trusted supplier John Guest, and the school, by providing an E6 Chilled only water dispenser.

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### Solution

Borg & Overström donated a water dispenser to the school which provides limitless chilled water for the students. The E6 Chilled only water dispenser was provided with SensorBeam®, projected, touchless dispense, delivering not only a hygienic but an interactive way of dispensing water. Placed in a high-footfall school corridor, the dispenser provides convenient access for students to refill their bottles easily throughout the day.

It was important to the Head Teacher that the pupils could regulate their hydration levels whilst at school, allowing them to stay focused and concentrate in class. It's been proven that being even a tiny bit dehydrated can massively impact the effectiveness of learning.

The pupils appreciated having access to fresh, great-tasting filtered water during the day, with the confidence that it is dispensed hygienically despite the high number of users in the school.
